

Job Description:

The KSU is hiring a student to revitalise the King's Racialised Students' Collective. The collective has been a means of creating community between racialised students through peer support and meaningful relationships. The RSC room is a closed safe space for racialised students with books, snacks and resources. We are looking for a student who is passionate about re-establishing this community space for racialised King's students.

The coordinator will be paid an honorarium of \$500 dollars.

Responsibilities:

- Organising at least one RSC event per month (can be a recurring monthly event or different events every month)
- Creating and running social media for the RSC to promote RSC events and connect students with external resources or events for racialised students
- Collaborating with the KSU Advocacy Representative and the King's Director of Equity and Community Supports to advocate for racialised students
- Collaborating with the BIPOC Peer Mentorship group to help fund or support them in any way they might need
- Collaborating with other campus racialised student groups
- Looking into a possible change of name for the collective by seeking out student feedback
- Building the collective according to student wants and needs
- Implementing other community building ideas
- Creating an end-of-year report on the Collective's performance with suggestions for future coordinators

*The coordinator will have a \$500 dollar starting budget, with access to society funding

Requirements:

- Must be a racialised student
- Must be a current King's student
- Basic understanding of social media and designing graphics/posters
- Some knowledge of racialised student services and supports at King's and Dalhousie

Assets:

- Organised and responsible
- Strong communication skills
- Previous leadership experience
- Openness to learning and adapting within the role
