Elections Committee

Supports the Chief Returning Officer (CRO) in running KSU elections, by supervising the voting booth and administering the strike policy in cases of breaches of elections procedure. The committee meets as needed during the fall and spring elections, and **nine (9) seats are available**.

Bylaw Review Committee

Interested in reviewing the KSU's bylaws, and updating them to reflect current practices and/or make improvements to Union operations? **Two (2) seats are available** on the Bylaw Review Committee.

Finance Committee

Want to keep the Union financially accountable by reviewing and voting on society funding requests, overseeing the Union's financial transactions, books, and records, helping to create the KSU budget, and more? **Three (3) seats are available** on the Finance Committee.

Academic Committee

Want to learn about and advocate for your peers on academic accessibility, changes in curriculum, and other academic issues that matter to you? Nominate yourself for one of **three (3) seats that are available** on the Academic Committee!

Equity Affairs Committee

This committee has not been active for several years, but if you care about equity and would like to help bring it back please nominate yourself! **Four (4) seats are available**.

Description from the KSU Operations Policy: "The Equity Affairs Committee has a mandate to formulate and draft Union policy on issues of equity relating to race, gender, religion, physical and mental disability and sexual orientation. While not a disciplinary body, the Committee will receive and evaluate general equity complaints regarding the Union and the wider University. Complaints regarding individuals will be forwarded to the appropriate University bodies."

Graduation Committee

Join this committee if you are a graduating student who wants to organize a Grad Week that will end your time at King's with a bang! The Graduation Committee raises funds for the Graduating

Class gift and Graduation Week activities, selects through an official election process an Honorary Class President, Graduation Class gift and a Valedictorian, organizes Graduation Week activities and arranges graduation photos.

The Graduation Committee is looking for a President, a Secretary and a Treasurer. The President leads the work of the committee, including organizing events. The Secretary organizes, promotes and takes minutes at committee meetings, and organizes and promotes events and elections. The Treasurer oversees committee funds and creates a budget in cooperation with the Financial Vice President. All members of the graduating class will be invited to attend committee meetings, not just those who hold these elected positions.

Wardroom Advisory Committee

Is the Wardy your favourite place on campus? You can get more involved with the business by joining the Wardroom Advisory Committee, which oversees and advises on the finances and business operation of the Wardroom. Two (2) student seats are available.

Student Workers Committee (Special Committee of the Union)

This committee is designated to advocate for student workers rights on campus. The goal is to have representatives from as many different groups of student workers as possible. The committee will not be limited to elected individuals, and anyone who holds a student job on campus will be welcome to attend and provide insights during the committee's meetings.

An elected seat is available for a student who holds each of the following positions:

- One (1) student who is a Don or Junior Don)
- One (1) student who is a member of Patrol staff
- One (1) student who is a member of Alex Hall front desk staff
- One (1) student who is a member of Registrar's Office staff
- One (1) student who is a member of Chartwells staff
- One (1) student who is a member of Facilities staff
- One (1) student who is a member of Conference Services staff
- One (1) student who is a member of Library staff
- One (1) student who is a member of Gym staff
- One (1) student who is a member of Galley staff
- and One (1) student who is a member of Wardroom staff
- For a total of eleven (11) seats

King's Sexualized Violence Prevention Implementation Advisory Committee

The SVPIAC is a group of staff, faculty, and student reps who work to ensure that the King's Sexualized Violence policy is known, accessible, and provides the best support to all of our campus community members. Meetings are typically every other month for roughly an hour and a half (set each month by Doodle poll) and committee members are sometimes asked to take on tasks between meetings. Work includes policy review and revision, looking at how the values and processes embedded in the policy are practically implemented in our community, and supporting the work of the Sexual Health and Safety Officer. At times, SVPIAC members may

also be asked to sit on Outcomes Panels, which review reports of sexualized violence and provide recommendations for outcomes to the President. Members of the SVPIAC are required to sign a confidentiality agreement. **Three (3) student seats are available.**

King's Board of Appeal and Discipline

Hears appeals on non-academic disciplinary matters. A committee of the University that has **one (1) student representative seat.**

King's Dining Services Advisory Committee

Do you have a lot of opinions about Prince Hall? The Dining Services Advisory Committee provides feedback and recommendations to King's dining services provider, informed by the nutritional, financial and social needs of the campus community. A committee of the University that has **two (2) student representative seats.**
